For Advent Sunday, the first candle on the wreath is lit. At 8:00 a.m., we say as follows:

Celebrant: Blessed are you, Sovereign Lord,

All: God of our ancestors: to you be praise and glory for ever!

Celebrant: You call all people to live by the light of faith, and to journey in the hope of your promised fulfilment.

May we be obedient to your call and be ready and watchful

To receive your Christ, a lamp to our feet and a light to our path,

For you are our light and salvation.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

At 10:00 a.m., the choir sings as follows, with the congregation joining in the parts marked "Full":

Confession and Absolution follow.

During Advent, instead of the Gloria, we say together:

Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, have mercy on us.

Collect of the day and of the season:

Eternal God, you have taught us that the night is far spent and the day is at hand: keep us awake and alert, watching for your kingdom, and make us strong in faith, so that when Christ comes in glory to judge the earth, we may go out joyfully to greet him; and, with all your saints, may worship you for ever; through Jesus Christ our Lord,; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and for ever. **Amen**.

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility: that, on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians.

How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you?

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

Every day he was teaching in the temple, and at night he would go out and spend the night on the Mount of Olives, as it was called. And all the people would get up early in the morning to listen to him in the temple.
