GOSPEL

Luke 3:7–18



The Spirit of the Lord is upon me;

He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.'
Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?'

He said to them,

'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation,
and be satisfied with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation,
and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John,
whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying,
'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming;
I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals.
He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.
His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor
and to gather the wheat into his granary;
but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.
For the gospel of the Lord.

COMMISSIONING OF CHURCH WARDENS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

Vicar: My brothers and sisters, we are all called to be the Body of Christ, the community of the Holy Spirit.
The risen Lord Jesus pours out on his baptized people gifts and graces for the work of the Church.
Today we commission these of our number who have been chosen to lead us as Churchwardens, and members of the Parish Council.
Together with the Vicar, a Parish Council carries responsibility for the health and growth of God's Church in this place.
In addition, Churchwardens bear particular responsibility for its financial and material well-being.

The Vicar addresses those to be commissioned:

Lay leaders of this parish, I now ask each of you to answer before God and in the presence of this congregation: Will you undertake your tasks wholeheartedly and faithfully, alive to the joy that Christian service brings?

Those appointed and elected respond:

I will, with God's help, and the prayerful support of others.

Vicar: I commission you for the positions to which you have been appointed and elected, and assure you of my prayers and support.

The Vicar then addresses the congregation:

People of St George's, you have heard our brothers and sisters commit themselves to these ministries.

Will you pray for them, support and encourage them, open yourselves to their leading, and work with them, so that Christ's church in this place may be built up in love?

We will, with God's help.

The Vicar continues:

Let us pray:

Living God, you have called us to be the Body of Christ.

May our parish be a sign of hope in this community.

May all we do, and all we are becoming,

bring praise to your name and draw others to your love.

We ask these things in the name of Jesus,

who came to serve and bring us the fullness of life. **Amen.**

The Vicar concludes:

May God bless you and make fruitful all that you undertake in God's name. **Amen.**
