Celebrant: Blessed are you, Sovereign Lord.

All: Merciful and gentle to you be praised and glory forever.

Celebrant: Your light has shone in our darkened world through the child-bearing of blessèd Mary; grant that we who have seen your glory may daily be renewed in your image and prepared like her for the coming of your Son, who is the Lord and Saviour of all.
 All: Blessèd be God for ever!

SENTENCE

Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.

We say together:

During Advent, instead of the Gloria, we say together:

Holy God,
holy and mighty,
holy and immortal,
have mercy on us.

SECOND READING

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

When Christ came into the world, he said,
'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me;
in burnt-offerings and sin-offerings you have taken no pleasure.
Then I said, "See, God, I have come to do your will, O God"

(in the scroll of the book it is written of me).'

When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' (these are offered according to the law), then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
